


FAQ's About Carpet Installation

Will Carpet Installers Move My Furniture for Carpet Installation?

Most carpet installers are willing to move furniture in rooms that are being carpeted if you wish for them to do so. Take note, however that if you go that route, the installer will not be liable for any damage that may occur. If you prefer to avoid risks, you can always choose to empty out the room yourself prior to installation day or hire movers to do that part of the job. Be sure to remove small objects yourself and clean out closets, if they will be receiving carpeting.







How Long Will My Carpet Installation Project Take?

The most honest answer is it depends. When it comes to installing carpeting, there are many factors that will impact the length of time it takes to complete the project. Factors like the size of the room, the size of the project, whether or not old carpeting must be removed prior to installing new, as well as the type of carpet being installed (ie, wall to wall carpet, carpet squares, stair runners) will all effect the time frame for the project to be completed. For example, if you are replacing carpet in a large house, the project could take an entire day or possibly even several days to complete, whereas installing a simple carpet runner could be done within a few hours. Thus, for the most accurate estimate of time, speak with your installer.



How Long Will Wall to Wall Carpet Last?

Quality carpeting will hold up for many years when cared for correctly. Although, in general, most carpeting should be replaced within 10-15 years. Typically, carpets will begin to show their wear within that time frame, especially in high traffic areas. However, remember that these are general guidelines as there are different grades of carpeting available. Depending upon the quality of the carpet you choose, replacement may be necessary prior to the 10-year mark or may exceed the 15-year mark before showing wear.

The most common issue that people have with their carpets is rippling/wrinkles. Thankfully, this can be avoided by choosing a reputable, experienced installer. When carpet is measured properly and professionally installed, using proper procedure, it will look great now and in the future.




Is Carpet Padding Necessary?
